

**How to prepare for your visit to  
Scarborough Marsh Audubon Center  
92 Pine Point Road, Scarborough, ME**



Hello! We are excited to host you and your group at Scarborough Marsh. Here is a printable/shareable document with information for how staff can prepare their group for their field trip to Scarborough Marsh:

**Field Groups:** Please split your group or class into groups of approximately 10 students prior to your arrival at Scarborough Marsh. Each group will be assigned one Maine Audubon educator to lead their field study. Name tags are helpful.

**Chaperones:** Please arrange the necessary amount of chaperones to support your field trip. Each field group must be accompanied by at least one other adult in addition to your Maine Audubon educator. Please read and distribute the *Chaperone Information Sheet* to your grownups.

**Attire:** The majority of time at Scarborough Marsh will be spent outdoors, and programs will be canceled in the case of severe weather. Please make sure students come with the necessary layers to stay warm and dry. On sunny days, sun hats and sunscreen are recommended. Students should wear footwear that is comfortable and sufficient for walking on wet trails. Students can expect that their shoes will get wet, so they're welcome to bring an extra pair if needed. Please have students bring a water bottle.

**Bathroom:** There is no running water at Scarborough Marsh. A portapotty is available if absolutely necessary. Students should be encouraged to use the bathroom before departing school.

**Lunch:** Please contact us directly if you're interested in staying for lunch.

**Accommodations:** Please let the registrar or program coordinator know in advance if you need any accommodations.
